



ICRC Jordan, Support to Syrian Refugees during COVID 19

Key Humanitarian Challenge due to Covid-19:

 Humanitarian partners are seeing a growing number of people in dire need, and an increased number of complaints from refugees about a lack of the most urgent survival support.

ICRC Response:

ECONOMIC SECURITY Support

- Maintain the cash-support for 720 families in urban settings through the CTP programme by providing 2 months (April, May) cash at the same time.
- Temporary cash assistance to 41 beneficiaries due to inability to pursue their Micro Economy (ME) project
- Delivered cash to the doorstep to 13 families, as they couldn't reach ATMs to withdraw money due to movement restrictions imposed by the government.

Restore Family Links (RFL)

To ensure continuous RFL service for in-camp refugees, the ICRC is now serving 319 beneficiaries through a rapidly established remote RFL service, allowing refugees to call the ICRC and be connected to their families, rather than seeking this service at the RFL antenna which had been temporarily closed due to government restrictions. This service can be extended to all in-camp refugees.
