INTRODUCTION



Unprecedented stress on the most advanced health-care systems. Extreme strain on major economies and financial markets. A global shutdown such as the world has never seen before.

This is today's reality as COVID-19 continues to spread unabated in over 160 countries across the world. With the Asia-Pacific region being home to 60 per cent of the world's population — i.e. some 4.3 billion people — an uncontrolled outbreak could be devastating.

To contain the spread of COVID-19, early efforts have included strict measures such as restriction on movement and lockdowns. Some countries face an already compromised public health-care system, overcrowded detention facilities, densely populated camps of displaced populations and informal settlements, adding layers of vulnerability for populations already facing immense challenges.

With a well-coordinated and well-resourced response mechanism involving national and international actors, the danger can be averted.

Our response

Like elsewhere, in the Asia-Pacific region also the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) has joined the massive efforts being carried out by governments, international community and humanitarian organizations to fight the spread of novel coronavirus. We have massively adjusted, and where relevant, launched new initiatives to support national authorities, health-care facilities, places of detention and local Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies to respond to the pandemic.

Our operational response to COVID-19 in the region focuses on four main areas:

- Supporting health-care facilities
- · Infection-control in detention facilities
- Humanitarian forensics (management of the dead)
- Support to National Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies

In the following pages, you will see a country-wise overview of the ICRC operational response to COVID-19 in the Asia-Pacific region.





OPERATIONAL ORIENTATION

- In Afghanistan, the ICRC is part of the COVID-19 taskforce led by the Ministry of Public Health, along with World Health Organization, Afghan Red Crescent, International Federation of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, and others.
- Our operational response to COVID-19 focuses on prevention and infection-control in places of detention and supporting the health facilities. Additionally, we are also adapting our existing water and sanitation activities.



OPERATIONAL ORIENTATION

As part of our persuasion efforts, we are holding highlevel dialogue and engagement with authorities to ensure safeguards for vulnerable populations, including our recommendation for immediate decongesting measures such as early release and parole.

- Benefiting close to 18,500 people, 15 drums of chlorine and 400 litres of fuel donated to Marawi City District.
 This two-month supply will serve urban centers and the camps.
- Provided personal protective equipment to frontline responders in conflict-affected areas in Mindanao.




- We have adapted our humanitarian response across the country to the new realities of COVID-19 while keeping our robust operations on for victims of different armed conflicts and other situations of violence.
- We are maintaining essential operations in Kachin, Rakhine and Shan states, while maximizing prevention efforts for COVID-19 together with the Myanmar Red Cross Society and to support the Ministry of Health and Sports.

- Rakhine: Infrastructural support for building six handwashing facilities for communities, improvement of handwashing stations in schools, building over 100 handwashing facilities and donation of soaps in IDP camps to benefit over 30,000 people, mobile handwashing stations for distribution drives.
- Kachin: WASH installations improved and partition walls built to ensure social distancing in four educational institutes.

OPERATIONAL ORIENTATION

Preventive messaging on COVID-19 are being relayed for the displaced populations in Cox's Bazar and host families, as well as for people living in Chittagong Hill Tracts.

We are continuing to support more than 3,000 displaced people from Rakhine living in the camp of Konarpara who depend on humanitarian assistance for their survival. One-month food ration and hygiene material were recently distributed among them.

OPERATIONAL ORIENTATION

The ICRC regional delegation in New Delhi is closely working with the Indian Red Cross Society in its response to COVID-19. **More than 40,000 IRCS volunteers** are present on the front lines in all districts to support communities in this time of crisis.

- India: The regional delegation has shared guidance documents and good practices on health in detention (prevention of
 epidemics in prisons) and forensics, particularly dignified management of the dead, with Indian authorities, including the
 National Disaster Management Authority, and the ministries concerned.
- Maldives: The Maldivian Red Crescent (MRC) has set up a psychosocial support centre to help people in isolation
 and quarantine facilities. The National Society has also provided sensitization material to prisons and conducted
 COVID-19 awareness sessions for custodial officers. The volunteers are helping disseminate information on social
 distancing and respiratory hygiene and providing administrative support during COVID-19 related consultations at its
 branches. MRC's emergency response team is deployed at the airport to support the Maldivian health authorities
 in screening and immigration of returning Maldivians.
- Nepal: The Nepal Red Cross Society is supplying essentials to quarantine centres and broadcasting radio messages to
 generate awareness. The National Society has also distributed protective equipment to 80 ambulance drivers and
 trained them in safety measures and is calling out to blood donors to mitigate any shortage during the pandemic.




