ICRC



PROTECTING THE MOST VULNERABLE/ INCREASING RESILIENCE

- **6** pumping stations have been rehabilitated and upgraded in Mafraq & Irbid Governorates, in partnership with JRCS and Qatar Red Crescent Society (QRCS), serving **294,000** persons.
- **3** training sessions on operation and maintenance were conducted for **40** operators of the Yarmouk Water Company in collaboration with the Water Authority Training Center (WATC) in Amman/ Jordan.
- A new workshop and training center have been established in Hofa District, Irbid Governorate, with the specific goal of bolstering the operational capabilities and advancing the technical expertise of the Yarmouk Water Company's technical staff.
- **2** training sessions on water-efficient and environmentally friendly agricultural techniques (permaculture) were provided for **34** participants from agricultural communities, small farmers, and fresh graduates to increase their food-production skills and employability.
- **29** people received cash to meet their protection, health, and other essential needs.
- **25** sports wheelchairs were donated to the Za'atari camp, and an additional **11** to the Ajyal Al Ghad Club in Mafraq City. These donations aim to provide individuals with disabilities suitable equipment for practice and to support the wheelchair basketball teams both in the camp and across Mafraq City.



SUPPORTING FAMILIES OF MISSING PERSONS

- **69** Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS) sessions were delivered in Amman, Mafraq, Irbid and Zarqa for **106** members of families of missing persons as a result of the conflict in Syria.
- **777** people benefitted from the Micro Economic Initiative grants to start income-generating activities as part of the Accompaniment Program for families of missing persons.
- **332** people received cash to meet their protection, health, and other essential needs as part of the Accompaniment Program for families of missing persons.
- **113** people received unconditional cash for startups to meet their basic needs including winterization support.
- **1** workshop on “*The Legal Status of Missing Persons in the Jordanian Personal Status Law*” was held, in partnership with the Sharia Judicial Institute and Al Al-Bayt University to discuss legal challenges of the families of missing persons as a result of the conflict in Syria.



ENSURING RESPECT FOR THE DIGNITY OF PEOPLE DEPRIVED OF THEIR LIBERTY

- **1** roundtable was held with Directors of health directorates in different governorates and the Directors of Correction and Rehabilitation Centers (CRC).
- **1** workshop on various healthcare in detention themes was conducted for **35** CRC health workers.
- **320** kg of personal protective equipment were donated to Al-Bashir Hospitals detention ward.
- ICRC supported the Ministry of Health (MOH) to deploy Hakeem Health Information System in Marka CRC clinic.
- **126** patients were consulted by ICRC Detention Doctor, of which **12** patients with disabilities received mobility aid devices.
- **499** Detainees in **11** places of detention received individual follow ups during **30** visits, of which **45** were female detainees.
- **870** Red Cross Messages (RCM) and Safe & Well messages were collected and exchanged between detainees and their families.
- **11** family visits facilitated by the ICRC between village 5 in Azraq camp and the CRCs benefiting **8** detainees.
- **800** detainees benefited from ICRC assistance: hygiene kits, clothing, phone cards, and books.
- A two-day workshop on ICRC's work in detention, legal frameworks, and international standards was organized for **47** staff of the General Intelligence Directorate (GID).



HUMANITARIAN PLATFORM

- Based on an invitation by the Royal Hashemite Court of Jordan, the ICRC's President, Mirjana Spoljaric, participated in the meeting on 'Coordinating Gaza Emergency Relief' in Amman, headed by His Majesty King Abdullah II and attended by several international agencies and diplomats.
- ICRC's President held a bilateral meeting with His Majesty King Abdullah II to discuss the urgent need for IHL respect, the challenges faced by humanitarian actors to deliver assistance to Gaza and the impact of the conflict on civilians and infrastructure in Gaza.
- **6** Red Talks on Protection of Migrants, Misinformation Disinformation and Hate Speech, climate adaption in conflict areas in the NAME, completion of ICRC water program in Jordan and the role of IHL in modern conflicts.
- **2** training sessions on de-escalation of violence were conducted for **40** health personnel from MoH (Emergency Department, Correctional and Rehabilitation Centres Directorate (CRCD), Jordan Red Crescent Society (JRCS) and Civil Defense) under the initiative of Health Care in Danger which was followed by a ToT to **20** participants to share the knowledge with respective staff.



STRENGTHENING EMERGENCY AND CRISIS PREPAREDNESS

- **4** Basic Emergency Care (BEC) training sessions were delivered for **80** paramedics from the Civil Defense followed by **2** BEC Training of Trainers sessions (ToT) for **16** paramedics.
- Emergency Room Trauma Care (ERTC) training was conducted for **20** doctors from the Ministry of Health (MoH) followed by one ERTC ToT for **18** doctors.
- **8** sets of splints and **8** sets of collars were donated to the Civil Defense.
- **1** Emergo Train System (ETS) tool Kit and **60** trauma bags were donated to the MoH.
- **2** Jordanian Armed Forces (JAF) officers participated in Senior Workshop on International Rules governing Military Operations (SWIRMO) held in Nairobi.
- **2** JAF officers attended training on International Humanitarian Law (IHL) in San Remo, Italy.
- **4** IHL-focused sessions were conducted for **460** personnel, including JAF members and international officers, across two venues. At Peacekeeping Operations Training Center (POTC), these sessions formed a key part of the pre-deployment training for Peace Support Operations, providing essential IHL insights for field application. Simultaneously, at Royal Jordanian Command and Staff College (RJCS), they were an integral part of the Staff and Command training for majors and higher ranks, aimed at preparing future commanders with a deepened understanding of IHL in leadership roles.
- **584** police officers participated in **40** workshops and briefings on International Human Rights Law (IHRL) and IHL.
- In collaboration with the ICRC, the Public Security Department (PSD) has developed and released a comprehensive guide on the “Lawful Use of Force” as part of the PSD’s curriculum.



PARTNERSHIP WITH THE JORDAN RED CRESCENT SOCIETY (JRCS)

- Red Crescent Action Teams (RCAT) operational capacities were reinforced through preparedness and first aid training of **40** volunteers from Tafileh and Karak branches.
- **110** RCAT volunteers provided first aid services through JRCS mobile first aid stations positioned at key events, including first aid services provision at **4** marathons in Jordan.
- **276** community members received first aid training level (1) throughout the year.
- **18** volunteers from the north were reinforced through the Red Cross Red Crescent Movement Induction programmes.
- JRCS training facility was refurbished in preparation for the launch of its commercial first aid project to enable financial sustainability in the future.
- Head of JRCS branches were sensitized through **3** Safer Access (SAF) sessions held throughout the year.
- The first aid capacity was bolstered through **2** ToTs held in Aqaba and Irbid governorates.



PROMOTING INTERNATIONAL HUMANITARIAN LAW (IHL)

- **200** students from Jordan universities participated in IHL disseminations.
- **2** IHL training sessions were conducted targeting **50** civil and military judges and prosecutors.
- **8** IHL disseminations in collaboration with Jordan's National Commission of the International Humanitarian Law (NCIHL) were conducted targeting **200** persons from various governmental institutions.



THE REGIONAL RESOURCE NETWORK

- **30** representatives of humanitarian and development organizations met to discuss the compounding humanitarian consequences of climate change, environmental degradation, and armed conflict in the Near and Middle East, with attention to specific vulnerabilities of displaced people.
- A five-day training in Assessing Economic Security was delivered to **25** volunteers and staff from the Egyptian Red Crescent. The training covered assessment, data collection, reporting, and included a field day to conduct assessment.



THE LOGISTICS SUPPORT CENTRE (LSC)

- **4.3** MLN CHF orders for Gaza which medical items, food, essential non-food items were delivered from Amman Logistics Support Centre.
- **7,071** item lines of medical supplies, prosthetics, and essential relief household items with total value of **17.2** MLN CHF were shipped from Jordan to **62** destinations mainly Gaza, Yemen, Syria, Iraq, Lebanon, Turkey, Sudan, Ukraine, and Armenia.
- **233** pallets of humanitarian aid (Weapon wounded kits, medical items, first aid kits, syringes) were sent to Syria in response to the earthquake with the value of **1.5** MLN CHF, while tents, blankets, sleeping bags were sent to Turkey with the value of **200** K CHF.
- **22** complete weapon wounded kits and medical sets were sent to Sudan in response to the armed conflict with the value of **503** K CHF.
